Youth Apprenticeship Industry Scholarships help build futures

What are SYA Industry Scholarships?

Saskatchewan Youth Apprenticeship (SYA) Industry Scholarships are awarded to selected, eligible high school graduates throughout the province who have completed the SYA Program and will be pursuing a career in the skilled trades.

Saskatchewan Youth Apprenticeship Industry Scholarships, valued at \$1,000 each, will be awarded to students from eligible provincial high schools each June.

How the scholarship works

Each scholarship winner will receive a certificate for a \$1,000 scholarship. To qualify for the scholarship, the student submits the certificate along with

satisfactory proof that the criteria have been met.

To qualify for the scholarship

- Both the high school and the student must participate in Saskatchewan Youth Apprenticeship
- The candidate must:
 - complete high school in the current school year
 - hold a completed youth apprenticeship passport
 - within two years of completing high school, the graduate must either:
 - be entered into a contract of apprenticeship in a designated skilled trade for a year or
 - complete one year of post-secondary training in a designated skilled trade*

Schools are selected by the SATCC

The Saskatchewan Apprenticeship and Trade Certification Commission (SATCC) will select a minimum of 40 provincial high schools for the scholarships. If your school is selected, you will be asked to identify one student to receive the award.

Winners are selected by the schools

The graduate's achievements, dedication and need can all be considered when choosing a scholarship winner.

The scholarship certificates will be made available for presentation at the graduation ceremony or other high profile event of your choice.
